What you will gain

Leaders and managers of humanitarian organizations will benefit from a multi-disciplinary and multi-sectoral understanding of the changes taking place and their implication for policy and strategy. The evolving humanitarian landscape is requiring aid workers and actors to acquire new knowledge and skills. The course aims to provide humanitarian actors with an opportunity to assess, learn and reflect on critical aspects of humanitarian work. It is delivered using a structured approach that is highly interactive allowing peer learning, personal insights and complemented with insights from facilitating experts. On completion, participants will have greater understanding of:

- Humanitarianism today and the different mechanisms to respond to humanitarian needs locally and globally.
- The social, political and economic contexts that affect humanitarian policy and practice
- The past, present and potential future of the humanitarian discourse

Topics covered

The course will be delivered in five broad topics outlined below. These will analyse conceptual issues and examine the trends in humanitarian responses in disaster and conflicts in Africa using specific case studies within the key clusters in humanitarian response.
